Being a prodigal parent:

So he returned home to his father. And while he was still a long way off, his father saw him coming. Filled with love and compassion... (Luke 15:20)

Here is the story of the prodigal son. He asks for his dad's entire life savings (his inheritance) before his dad was even dead. (He's basically saying, "Dad, I wish you were dead, you're pretty much dead to me, so at least give me your ENTIRE life's work in money.") His dad could have said no. There was no indication his son was going to invest it in an IRA or build a well in Africa with this money. But dad gives it to him anyway. Talk about enabling! His dad FINANCED his son's rebellion. But to his dad, it was an investment in the hope that his son would at least know his dad loves him. At least this way the son may come back. And it turns out, his dad was right. The son comes home! And when he does, and is "still a long way off," his dad is filled with...COMPASSION??

When you and I look at "sinners" a LONG way off (living far from God), what are we FILLED with? The dad probably couldn't tell if his son was repentant (maybe he just wanted more money) and still he was FILLED with COMPASSION. Wow! Are you prepared to be a prodigal parent to someone who completely betrays you? What are you filled with while they are STILL a LONG way off?
